I love this script, and I must admit it's often seen as more of an actors' piece. Indeed, since its inception, each scene has been performed at countless festivals and competitions across the globe. He currently serves as an adjunct instructor for Pueblo Community College's Fine Arts, and Humanities Programs. He is a member of our board of directors and also works with WYNOT Productions and the Producers Group, creating work at the Sangre de Christo Art and Conference Center, including The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Avenue Q, and the upcoming production of Ride the Cyclone.

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



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
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
